## **BHS Career Pathways Guide**

Students select a pathway(s) when completing the 4-year plan.

Career Pathway – A selection of courses from a specific career or academic area that students progress through each year.

Ex. Sports Medicine Pathway 9<sup>th</sup> grade class – Foundations of Health Science

10<sup>th</sup> grade class – Sports Medicine Intermediate

11<sup>th</sup> grade – Sports Medicine Advanced

12<sup>th</sup> grade – Health Science Internships

#### Career Pathways are:

- A way to get students to think about future possibilities for college and career.
- A chance for students to focus in on an area of study to see if he/she might want to pursue a career or college studies in that area.
- An opportunity for students to learn to follow through with a sequence of classes long enough to potentially earn a certification or credential.
  - Several of our career pathways have certification exams that are available to students in high school ex.
     ServSafe Manager and ServSafe Food handler Certification, Guest Services Gold, Beef Quality Assurance,
     Microsoft Office Specialist, CPR Instructor, Autodesk Inventor Certified User and several available at Marshall County Technical School
- Chosen in the 8<sup>th</sup> grade and while students are encouraged to stick with a pathway long enough to see if he/she truly has an interest in that area, there is also flexibility along the way for students to make changes (at the appropriate time).

#### Career Pathways are not:

- Forcing students to choose a career or college major in the 8<sup>th</sup> grade.
- Limiting students to what can he/she can take in high school.
- Permanent and a student is stuck with it throughout high school.

There are many career pathways. Students are encouraged to choose 1 Pathway and take 1 course that pertains to that area each year of high school. Most pathways have a specific course for each year, but the liberal arts pathway has several course options that students may choose from during certain years. If a student swaps to a different pathway while in high school, he/she may be required to start back at the beginning course in that pathway. The Course Description Book gives information about each course and if there is a prerequisite for that course.

Some students are able to take courses from multiple pathways. This is not possible in the 9<sup>th</sup> grade, but as a student progresses to higher grade levels more flexibility is available in scheduling. Students who choose to attend Marshall County Technical School or the Snead State Aviation Technology program have all their elective choices filled by those programs. Therefore, those students are usually only able to stick to the 1 career pathway.
