



Option for students who complete Accelerated 7th and 8th grade math

- 9th grade = CP Geometry
- 10th grade = CP Algebra II w/Probability
- 11th grade = Precalculus or Dual Enrollment
- 12th grade = Dual Enrollment or AP Calculus

SCIENCE



- 9th Grade = Biology regular or CP
- 10th Grade = Chemistry regular or CP
- 11th & 12th choices: Forensic & Criminal Investigation, Anatomy/Physiology, Environmental, AP Chemistry, AP Biology, Physics or Dual Enrollment
- Career Tech substitutes: can't count for both CT & Science
 - Human Body Structures (can't count both this and Anatomy as science)
 - Principles of Engineering
 - Food Safety & Microbiology



SOCIAL STUDIES

9th grade – World History regular or CP

10th grade – U.S. History I regular or CP or DE

11th grade – U.S. History II regular or CP or AP or DE

 12th grade – Government/Economics regular or AP/CP or DE

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

All students are required to have 1
 Physical Education credit during high school – called Beginning Kinesiology

(Football, Basketball, Baseball, Softball, Volleyball, Cheer, Tennis, XC, Golf and Swim each have a class.)

 Two years of marching band will be required to fulfill the 1 credit of Physical Education. (Colorguard/Danceline members are not in band class unless they also play an instrument.)

HEALTH

- ½ credit of health is required for all students (take in 9th or 10th grade)
- Must be paired with another ½ credit:
 - Dr. Ed. (if 15 yrs. old & have permit at time of class)
 - Music Elements of Arts Literacy
 - Online course if in 10th grade or higher (Psy. Sociology, Nutrition, Personal Finance, etc)
- Foundations of Health Science (1 full credit) can substitute for health, but cannot also be used to fulfill a CTE elective.

CAREER PREPAREDNESS

- Career Preparedness Course

Most students will take in 9th grade.

FINE ARTS (pages 14-15) AND/OR CTE (pages 15 – 19) AND/OR FOREIGN LANGUAGE

• 3 credits required - Students choosing Arts Education, Career Tech, and/or Foreign Language are encouraged to complete two courses in sequence, but not required unless seeking to earn the Distinguished Scholar Distinction.

Dual Enrollment Courses are scheduled in accordance with the college schedule. Students return to BHS for all academic courses unless student or grant pays for dual enrollment academic course.

ACCESS — Alabama Connecting Classrooms, Educators, & Students Statewide

- Allows BHS to offer online and videoconference classes that might not be taught at our school, as well as to provide classes for students whose schools might not be able to offer courses that we have available.
- Typically, upperclassmen are scheduled into these classes first. Freshman are not normally scheduled into these classes.
- These classes are scheduled in the computer lab with a facilitator to help with technical issues, but the teacher does not necessarily know the course content.

AP & COLLEGE PREP

- AP classes cost \$97 this covers the AP test that is given in May. A fee waiver is available to help students who qualify based on income.
- AP classes receive 10 points on the semester average.
- Students are encouraged to take College Prep classes in order to prepare for the AP classes.
- CP classes receive 5 points on the semester average.

DISTINGUISHED SCHOLAR – pg. 5

- Pre-calculus as the 4th math
- 11th/12th grade sciences must be from the following:
 AP Chemistry, AP Biology, Physics, Anatomy, or DE
- One AP or one college dual enrollment course
- Two College Prep courses
- A sequence of two courses in foreign language, career tech education or arts education.
- ➤ Any college dual enrollment course or AP course can be substituted for an College Prep course.
- ➤ 80 average must be earned each semester in every class for high school credit.

VALEDICTORIAN & SALUTATORIAN

- Top two students academically in the graduating class.
- •Based on GPA from <u>core classes only</u> (Math, Science, English, History and Foreign Language) through first semester of senior year.
- Must be a Distinguished Scholar to be eligible.

THINGS TO THINK ABOUT

Beginning in 9th grade, your grades count toward your cumulative GRADE POINT AVERAGE (GPA). This is an important part of applying for scholarships as a Senior.

Involvement in clubs, community service, and academic organizations is also an important part of applying for scholarships as a Senior. Pages 21 - 22 in the booklet lists many opportunities for involvement at BHS.

THINGS TO THINK ABOUT

The National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) and the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) both have specific requirements you must meet in order to qualify to play sports in college. Students should visit the NCAA Eligibility center online to see requirements.
